Romans 12:21

Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

The Law: God's Great Expectations for His People

The Lord demands <u>perfection</u> in thought, word and deed.

Leviticus 19:2

Be holy because I, the Lord your God, am holy.

1 Corinthians 3:17

God's temple is sacred, and you together are that temple.

Matthew 5:48

Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

The Gospel: God's Greatest Gift for His People

The Lord sends Jesus to fulfill what we have failed to do.

How does Jesus respond to evil? To His enemies?

Isaiah 53:5-6

He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on Him, and by His wounds we are healed. We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

Jesus' obedience qualifies Him as the only <u>substitute</u> and <u>Savior</u> for sinners. His sacrifice upon the cross is what makes us <u>holy</u> in God's sight.
